I've learned quite a bit during my first few months at Wahkiakum and have enjoyed getting to know the staff, students and families. Working in the community I live in is definitely allowing me to build new relationships with people that share my passion for working with children. I'm continually impressed by the number of people that reach out to see how they can support our school, staff and students.

Improving the academic achievement of our students is always at the core of our efforts at JAW and JCT. As we strive to meet the individual needs of each student, it's equally as important that we address the social-emotional needs that can often be a barrier to their academic success. All Wahkiakum staff participated in a training on the November in-service day that focused on trauma informed classrooms. This training provided staff with research about the impact trauma can have on brain development, behavior and ultimately academic success. I'm so proud of my staff and their willingness to implement structures in their classrooms and teach students strategies that help develop skills of self-regulation. I have no doubt that this new found knowledge will have a significant impact on our ability to reach ALL students.

As we enter the winter months, it is likely that inclement weather will interfere with our normal schedule. I’ve heard many people say we’re in for another crazy winter, but I’m going to keep my fingers crossed and hope that we’re not hit too hard (at least not Monday – Friday)!

Flash Alert is a free app available to Android and iPhone users. It distributes emergency messages, such as breaking news or weather closure information, and news releases.

School Messenger - An automated call goes out to the primary phone number identified in Skyward for students currently enrolled in the Wahkiakum School District.

Local Radio Stations - KEDO (1400 AM), KUKN (105.5 FM) and KLYK (94.5 FM) all provide information related to delays and closures due to weather for schools in the local area.

Portland News Stations - KATU (ABC), KOIN (CBS), KGW (NBC) and KPTV (Fox) announce weather related delays and closures.

Highly Capable Program – Highly capable students are students who perform or show potential for performing at significantly advanced academic levels when compared with others of their age, experiences or environments. In order to develop the abilities of each Highly Capable Program student, the district will offer a highly capable program which provides kindergarten through twelfth grade students selected for the program access to a basic education program that accelerates learning and enhances instruction. Anyone may a student for testing for the Highly Capable Program.

The referral forms for the 2018-2019 school placements will be available in each school office at the beginning of January. All parents must complete a Referral Form and give permission for the student to be tested and potentially placed in Highly Capable Programs.
